



DID YOU KNOW?


The Township received \$511,607 in Government grants to help with COVID-19 costs. The 2021 budget must be balanced (cannot budget for a deficit).




DID YOU KNOW?

The Township has incurred direct COVID expenses of \$125,000. Potential extra COVID costs could be as high as \$573,000.


\$1.7 M REVENUE LOSSES (PROJECTED)



\$1.7 M COST SAVINGS (PROJECTED)




How Property Tax is Calculated

- (2) deadline to file a Request for Reconsideration with MPAC for your 2021 property assessment is March 31, 2021.


How Your 2020 Property Taxes Were Distributed

The latest Provincial Budget proposes to lower all Business Education Tax (BET) rates to a rate of 0.88 percent for commercial and industrial properties beginning in 2021. Currently, 2020 BET rates are 0.98 percent for commercial and 1.25 percent for industrial.





Average Monthly Cost of Services* provided by the Township Per Household




Total Township Assets by Category








2020 Total Township Revenues and Expenditures Budgets



2020 Property Taxes by Classification




Impact of Proposed Budget on a House Assessed at \$600,000
